### How to get there?


#### By plain:

# A European Label for Sustainable Buildings



The Strategic Workshop “A European Label for Sustainable Buildings”, organised in the framework of the LEnSE project aims to demonstrate to policy makers and industry representatives the importance and advantages of an integrated approach towards sustainable construction. The importance of this integrated approach has been recently emphasised by the publication of the **Lead Market Initiative** by the European Commission (COM(2007) 860 final), in which *Sustainable Construction* is selected as one of the lead markets for Europe to put into practice the Lisbon objectives of a knowledge-based economy and its consequent Innovation Strategy for the European Union.



The workshop is oriented at European Commission representatives from all DGs directly or indirectly affected by sustainable construction, policy makers from European, national and regional level, high-level industry representatives and their European federations, but also tool developers of existing assessment methods.

The presentations and discussion should lead to a larger platform in support of an approach for sustainability assessment of buildings, to enable successful implementation of assessment tools and labelling, but also to underpin incentives or other policy measures.
